Grand Master Acceptance Speech (2025–2026) August 12, 2025 By Most Worshipful Grand Master Jeffery O Alexander

It is my vision that we, as a jurisdiction, return to being one strong, united body — where every brother is respected, where harmony is our foundation, and where we conduct ourselves in the spirit and tradition that Freemasonry was always meant to uphold. It means standing together, helping one another, and making sure no brother is left behind. We are not just members of a lodge—we are a family. When we stay connected, we grow stronger.

We will work under the trowel — smoothing over division, misunderstanding, and ego lying

the mortar of brotherly love with intention and care. We will not simply wear the square and compass; we will live by them. When President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the Federal Highway Act of 1956, he envisioned a connected nation — where one could drive from New York to California on roads that crisscrossed the land, poured with concrete and held together by a shared vision. That's the kind of love and unity I want us to build: a Masonic highway of brotherhood, where every lodge and every brother are connected with purpose, and our cement is the bond of fraternal affection.

Let us remember these words from the Book of Matthew, chapter 12, verse 50: "For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother." This scripture reminds us that family is not only by blood, it's by how we love, serve, and care for one another.

Let us also be prepared when one of our brothers is called home. I encourage the use of the short form of the funeral service created by MWPGM Arturo V. De Los Reyes — a respectful and meaningful way to honor our departed Brothers, especially when time or resources are limited. I know it is not part of our official Code of Laws, but it only takes three Brothers to stand together and say farewell.

Edict No. 51. Section 251.02

It shall be the prerogative of the MWGM or any Worshipful Master to waive the official dress requirement if a Master Mason has a logical excuse. The one exception where a waiver is not acceptable is at a funeral and the Lodge of Sorrow, where the white or Lambskin apron shall be worn as official regalia. Subordinate Lodge Officers, Past Masters, and Grand Lodge Officers are authorized to wear the Jewel of their respective offices. During the funeral service, the jewels will be draped in black.

Let us greet each other as "Brothers" because there is no sweeter sound to a Mason's ears than to be called Brother. Let us not forget our older brothers, whom we don't see on a regular basis. Let's pick up the phone and say, "Hello, we miss you."

We will establish a Grand Master's Council, drawing on the wisdom and experience, our seasoned Brethren carry. Let us also extend our highest respect and unwavering support to our Sisters of the Order of the Eastern Star. They walk beside us in both light and labor, and they deserve our appreciation, partnership, and full recognition as an essential part of our Masonic family. I encourage each of you to set aside time to be with your children, your wives, your significant others. Spend time listening, learning, and laughing with those who are closest to you. These moments of connection and love nurture the very principles of brotherhood we hold dear. A Mason's heart is made stronger by the love and support of those he holds dearest. Let us not be so focused on our duties that we neglect the love that sustains us in all things.

Our children learn from us not only what we say, but what we do. Let them see us living the values of our Craft in the way we treat our families—with patience, kindness, and understanding. If we can be strong at home, we will be strong in our lodges. If we can be present with those who matter most, we will bring a deeper, more genuine presence to the work we do together as Masons. So, let us strive for balance, so that our family life is as rich and rewarding as the bond we share as Brothers.
